Networking Topics

AI Practices and Policies

Description: Participants will brainstorm ways to incorporate AI into the curriculum, discuss potential benefits and drawbacks, and draft policies to guide ethical AI use in schools.

Opening Question: How can we effectively integrate Al technologies into our current curriculum to enhance student learning and engagement? What policies should we consider to ensure ethical and effective use of Al in our schools?

Align the Work

Description: Participants will identify current district and site-level goals, discuss alignment strategies, and develop a plan to ensure all stakeholders are working towards the same objectives.

Opening Question: In what ways can we align our district-level goals with site-level goals to create a more cohesive and effective educational environment? What are some strategies we can use to ensure all stakeholders are working towards the same objectives?

Insist on Rigor

Description: Participants will discuss current levels of rigor in classrooms, identify areas for improvement, and brainstorm strategies to overcome potential obstacles.

Opening Question: How can we maintain and increase rigor in our classrooms to ensure our students are being adequately challenged and prepared for their future? What are some potential obstacles we might face in this endeavor and how can we overcome them?

Funding AVID

Description: Participants will brainstorm strategies to secure funding for the AVID program, discuss ways to demonstrate its value and impact, and develop a plan to present to potential funders.

Opening Question: What strategies can we employ to secure sufficient funding for the AVID program? How can we demonstrate the value and impact of this program to potential funders?

Power of Professional Development

Description: Participants will discuss the role of professional development in achieving student outcomes, identify priority areas for professional development, and develop a plan to implement these opportunities.

Opening Question: How can we leverage the power of professional development to achieve our desired student outcomes? What types of professional development opportunities should we prioritize?

Coaching and Certification Instrument (CCI)

Description: Participants will explore how various sites are leveraging the CCI as a tool for continuous improvement. Discussion topics could include the process for CCI completion, aligning the CCI to site improvement plans, and ensuring that the CCI is a living document.

Opening Question: How is the CCI being used to improve your site's AVID implementation?

Collective Educator Agency

Description: Participants will engage in a discussion to identify current levels of educator efficacy and agency within the district. They will brainstorm strategies to foster an environment that promotes these aspects, including professional development opportunities, collaborative decision-making processes, and supportive leadership practices. The group will then develop a plan to implement these strategies, with the aim of enhancing collective educator efficacy and agency.

Opening Question: How can we foster an environment that increases collective educator efficacy and agency within our district?
